_ · · · · _ · · · . · . · ·	OSHA and the fire department require the workplace to have approved portable fire extinguishers  Fire extinguishers are meant to help control a fire until the fire department arrives  Evacuation is the priority  Do not put yourself at risk in order to suppress a fire  ABC fire extinguishers should be on hand to address combustible, flammable or electrical fires  Where should ABC extinguishers be located?  Fire extinguishers should be readily accessible  When obstructions cannot be avoided, arrows or signs must be used  Each unit should be mounted, so that to top of the extinguisher is not more than five feet off the ground  Travel distance cannot be more than 75 feet  Check your fire extinguisher for:  Easy access  Recommended pressure level – check gauge	<ul> <li>Working parts – the can, hose and nozzle should not be damaged, dented or rusted</li> <li>Cleanliness – remove any dust, oil or grease</li> <li>Maintenance – each extinguisher must be tested/charged to a fire protection professional on an annual basis</li> <li>When to use a fire extinguisher:         <ul> <li>Have I alerted others in the building/vicinity?</li> <li>Has someone called the fire department?</li> <li>Is the fire small and contained?</li> <li>Am I safe from fire's toxic smoke?</li> <li>Do I have a clear escape route?</li> </ul> </li> <li>How to use a fire extinguisher – remember "PASS"         <ul> <li>Pull the pin – hold the extinguisher with the nozzle pointing away from you and release the locking mechanism</li> <li>Aim low – point the extinguisher at the base of the fire</li> <li>Squeeze the lever slowly and evenly</li> <li>Sweep the nozzle from side to side</li> </ul> </li> <li>Sources: www.NFPA.org and U.S. Fire Administration</li> </ul>
