Each year thousands of forklift accidents are reported, resulting in injury or even death.  Accidents are typically the result of:  Collisions  Falls / tip overs  Struck-by Accidents  Following protocol is essential for accident-free operation	<ul> <li>Evaluation of oil, water and other fluid levels</li> <li>Condition of tires, forks, cables and connectors</li> <li>Verification of clean operator compartment</li> <li>Condition of load backrest, overhead guard and seatbelt</li> <li>Confirmation of steering, brakes, horn and lights</li> <li>Follow manufacturer's recommended schedule thereafter</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Safety Training</li> <li>Forklift operators must be certified per OSHA regulations:</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Safety First</li> <li>Always wear your seatbelt. Do not speed.</li> <li>Never exceed the rated load and assure it is balanced</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Certifications must be renewed every three years</li> </ul>	Do not roise or lower the load while traveling

- If operator observed operating in an unsafe manner
- Operator was involved in an accident

Refresher training must be completed:

- Operator is assigned to a different type of truck 0
- A condition in the workplace has changed

## **Forklift Maintenance**

Each forklift must be examined prior to use. Include:

- Be Prepared
- Assure work boots are clean and free of oil accumulation

Absolutely no horseplay

Do not raise or lower the load while traveling

Use horn at cross aisles and obstructed areas

Never give rides or use the forks to lift people

Keep a safe distance from pedestrians and platform edge

Be rested, alert and hydrated
